Class 10 and the International Steiner School Certificate

Students and teachers have been working in Class 10 with the International Steiner School Certificate (ISSC) since September. Assessment tasks have been set in English, History and Chemistry Main Lessons and in the regular Maths lessons. There are also ongoing programmes in German and French, Craft, Art, Eurythmy, Bothmer Gymnastics and Music that will be assessed by tests, portfolio, exhibition and/or presentation later in the year.

As those of you who attended Karen Brice-Geard's talk in September will know, we have chosen this way of assessing our students because, rather than prescribing what we teach, it works with the curriculum that we have developed for our students. For example, in History, the two assessments - 'Carry out a report on a historical investigation' and 'Demonstrate research skills' - could be applied to any lesson content. The tasks involved students learning how to do research on a chosen topic by first developing research questions, then finding relevant information from various resources and finally using the APA referencing system to cite sources used. These are skills all students need, and they can be applied in all subjects.

Similarly, in English, the tasks were 'Produce formal writing', in which students had to use specified elements of formal essay writing and structure the essay to a particular context, using appropriate language, and 'Respond to texts studied', where students demonstrated understanding through interpretation of narrative, structure and language and through appropriate choice of examples used to support their arguments.

Assessments in Chemistry and Maths have been through written tests so far, as we feel this is appropriate for these subjects.

If you would like more information about the ISSC, High School teachers are available to speak about it at parents' evenings in any class. Please let your class teacher know if this would be of interest.



Welcome back to all our families, including two new families with their children Eduard, Katia and Laurie who are settling into our early years community. Thank you for all your kind greetings, gifts and cards at Christmas time.

We have begun the year with the festival of Epiphany, when the three Kings or wise men gave their gifts to the baby Jesus. Rudolf Steiner said that this Festival links the past with the future for human beings and the cosmos, and it will be understood more deeply and will gain importance as time goes on. The children have enjoyed wearing colourful new tabards and crowns and taking the part of the Kings and star bearer in our morning ring time. Later each morning the Russian story of Baboushka has been listened to reverently.

Three kings came riding to follow a star,
Over mountain and valley and crag,

The school was inspected by the Schools Inspectorate Service in November 2013. The report is now available on the website. The Early Years was highly praised and many good and outstanding elements were noted in the rest of the school. The judgments, however, are disappointing, particularly as the teaching in the lower and upper school has been reinforced since the last inspection by the appointment of three new strong class teachers and two subject teachers who together bring much expertise and experience to the overall teaching of the school. Although there are aspects of the report which we do not intend to change, as they simply run contrary to the ethos of Steiner education, the College has already discussed some of the other comments made, and will continue to develop these areas; indeed some have already been addressed since the publication of the report (for example: Safeguarding training which was already booked at the time of the inspection and has now been completed).

If you have any questions about the report, please ask your Class/Kindergarten teacher to put them on the agenda for Parents' meetings this term.

We would like to thank the inspectors for their time and input.
