### News from the Early Years



In mid May we hosted Janni Nicol, Early Years representative for the Steiner Waldorf Schools Fellowship and puppeteer. As part of her visit she offered a puppetry workshop for our kindergarten Parents Evening. This was an uplifting and joyous event where we found our own voices through the everyday stories of our lives and discovered the power of simple puppets to bring these stories to life. Earlier in the day, children had been entranced by the visit of 'Lamby', a hand puppet, at snack time. Some had looked with big, wondrous eyes as his gestures reflected Janni's words or just stroked him gently, and even the oldest child in the kindergarten who earlier had said "he's just a puppet!" asked "Has he gone to sleep?" when Lamby had gone back to his suitcase. In the days that followed, many parents spoke of their warm connection with the evening and how they are bringing Janni's ideas and inspirations into their bedtime story routines. At the end of the evening, parents donated over £70



for IASWECE – the International Association for Steiner Waldorf Early Childhood Education – who do such good work all around the world in Waldorf teacher training, research and development.

The Early Years department celebrated National Children's Day on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> May with over fifty attendees at our Summer Outdoor Play Day. Popcorn popped over an open fire, hand-made (and real!) butterflies fluttered around the garden and children with their parents and friends enjoyed dancing and singing around the maypole. We were blessed

by beautiful weather and we would like to thank everyone who attended.

We have returned after half term to the beautiful Whitsun festival where we celebrate our diversity in peace. The white doves fluttering on golden crowns represent the tongues of fire which descended onto the heads of the disciples, giving them the gift of understanding. We honour this by endeavoring to learn 'Good Morning to You' in all the children's languages as part of our circle time, which this year will include Hungarian, Japanese, Mandarin, Portuguese, Punjabi, Russian, Slovakian, Spanish and Urdu.

Just before half term, the children enjoyed making wet-felted balls with ribbon streamers to practice throwing and catching – the ribbons help when they get stuck in the trees!

During these last few weeks of term our oldest kindergarten children are busy finishing their hobby horses. Begun in February, this big group of now fifteen children have washed and carded wool; sawn to size, peeled and sanded sturdy hazel poles; wound a ball of wool from a skein and learnt to finger knit, some even learnt double finger knitting. Many hours of work goes into each horse, which slowly takes shape with ears, eyes and mane appearing from week to week. It is a challenging task and children learn many new skills, sometimes quick workers help the slower ones, and all admire each other's handicraft! At the end of our term, we will look forward to seeing the fruits of their endeavours.

We are currently accepting applications to join kindergarten for September 2017, with a few part time and full-time vacancies still available. Please let your friends know and come to our Summer Fair on 10<sup>th</sup> June and Open Day on 24<sup>th</sup> June to find out more about our school and the Early Years department.

Lastly, we would like to thank all our parents for their support in providing their children with suitable sun hats and sun cream for the warm days ahead.

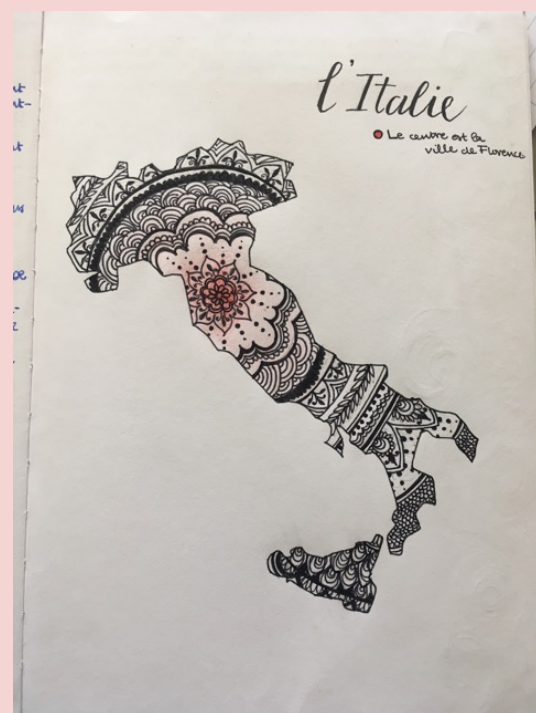

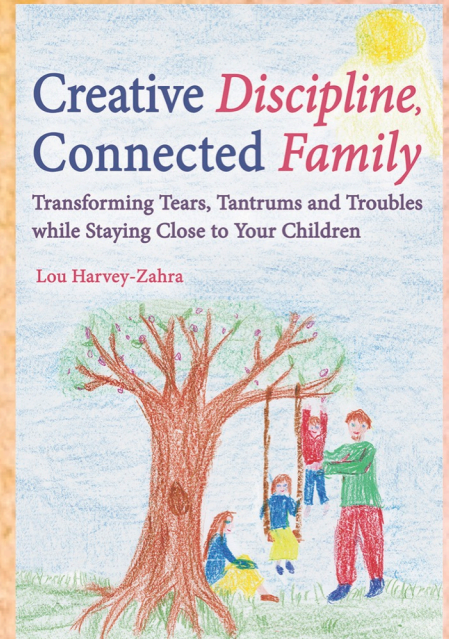
