Deaf people, in joit all sensory-deprived people find that their other senses become heightened. The deaf find their sight enhanced; the blind have stronger hearing. All these "superpowers" are actually the brain repurposing function and focus. parts that would ordinarily support the defunct of debilitated sense are put to work on other stronger senses. In effect, the brain revises itself. This is even more apporent if the sense is lost at birth. As a deaf child grows and develops, their brain will have plenty of time and apportunity to adopt and loss so.

Many aspets of life that were automatically geared and catered to the hearing population are now accessible to the deap. Many things however, we still inaccessible to the deap. For example; speeches on television and on stag over not always signed and many exhibitions are not irelasive.
