

Class 1 recently heard a story about a proud iris, waiting to bloom, and another about a lazy prince who must learn to work hard.














Our first ever **Duke of Edinburgh** expedition took place at the end of the Easter holidays. On the Saturday we met in Boston Manor Park and walked towards school along the Grand Union Canal and through Cranford Park. Initially in three separate groups expeditioners did their map orienteering training in the park to get their bearings. Then each group followed a route, meeting up at appropriate spots along the way. Each student took the initiative to map read and direct their group. The first group made great headway and arrived early with limited stopping times whereas the other two groups got a bit lost but rallied and made it to the end point. On the second day each group was able to learn from their first day experience and take a more steady and considered pace as we walked from school along the banks of the Crane river to Twickenham and on to our finishing point at Syon House. Each group also had to show how to put up a tent and boil water, plan their routes and set their times for each route section. When we reached Syon Park our bronze expeditioners presented on their themes for the expedition. They noticed that there was more wildlife on the canal than along the river and they spotted over 400 different birds on the way.

Ten bronzers, five silvers and six golders took part. Our next expedition will be over the May half-term in the Isle of Wight. Thanks to Alex Watson for helping with the expeditions.






Basketry work from Class 9.




