Martinmas in Kindergarten

On Friday 11 November, St Martin's Day, we celebrated Martinmas with our lantern walk. As the days are getting colder and the nights are getting longer, this festival reminds us about the sparks of light that we have inside us that bring hope and direction during the dark winter months. The generosity and kindness of St Martin, who, the legend says, shared his cloak with a poor beggar he encountered at the city gate of Amiens in France, inspire us to help others who may be less fortunate than us. Our children made beautiful lanterns out of their paintings, decorated them by rubbing leaves with coloured crayons, then oiled them to make the paintings translucent and finally shaped them into lanterns. They practised holding the lanterns steady and still during our ring time, along with the lantern songs. Their lanterns remained alight during our walk, while the singing filled the air with reverence and peace. Thank you to all the parents who baked the flapjacks and wrapped them beautifully in little parcels containing two of them. We ended the festival by gathering around the tall lime tree at the centre of our garden, hearing about the story of St Martin, and the symbolic gesture of giving the parcels to the children as they leave, with the message. "One for you, and one to give".

Parents' Eurythmy

...will be starting up again at the beginning of next term on Friday 13th January 2023, after study 9.50-10.50am. I look forward to seeing you. Everyone is welcome, bring your families and friends.

January 2023: PEDAGOGICAL EURYTHMY WORKSHOP: Volunteer(s) needed

On 27th and 28th January 2023, we will be hosting a group of eurythmy teachers for a weekend of pedagogical workshops which will take place at the church hall where I usually teach eurythmy.

We will have one workshop on the Friday evening and all day Saturday.

These eurythmy teachers come from Waldorf schools all over the country to attend.

It is usually a small-ish group, and I am looking for support in 2 areas to enable this to happen:

1) <u>Spare room, somewhere to sleep, an affordable or free place to rest:</u>

My colleagues will be most grateful for a place to lay their heads for the night. They are usually considerate and discreet.

They will need somewhere to stay for a night (Friday),

2) <u>Catering:</u>

One or two people who would be happy to cook for us; making vegetarian food for a group of approx 10/12 people for Friday early evening (a nice hearty soup and fresh bread will be warmly welcome) and lunch on Saturday. There is an oven at the hall, crockery and cutlery. The food will be paid for.

Ongoing: COSTUME DEPARTMENT

Since I started teaching at the school and guiding the children towards their eurythmy performances, we have been gathering costumes, silk dresses, tunics and veils of varied sizes and colours. This gives the children the chance to feel different, move differently as they use their veils to sculpt air into expression, and feel a certain freedom around them as they flow through space adorned by these garments.

The costumes have been taken on over the years by various class parents who have carried the financial load of buying the material, having them made and some even making them themselves. For this we, the children and I, are truly grateful.

We have reached a point where most of the costumes are being re-used and passed down from class to class. They need to be cared for.

This has taken a lot of hard work, support and commitment from class teachers and dedication. So to help us continue to care for all the costumes, as well as help make new ones, I am looking for a small group of parents to meet for coffee mornings/tea afternoons, to chat, sew poppers, and mend anything that requires attention. I am happy to find a way to start you off and show you the ropes if needed.

Eurythmy Therapy Fund

As you know, eurythmy is an essential part of any Waldorf school's curriculum. It can also be offered as a therapy for a wide range of issues from restlessness to flat feet and even short-sightedness. Since the school opened in 2001, we have provided eurythmy therapy to children who we think would benefit from it. We have never charged those children's parents because when a child receives a therapy that enables them to better engage in their lessons, it benefits everyone. We have applied to, and received money from, anthroposophical organisations to fund this provision, but it never covers the total cost. In the past, parents have made generous donations to make up the difference, which is usually between £1000 and £3000 in total per year.
